Affiliation fees	£3000	To provide all children with access to a variety of sporting competitions and festivals.	<p>Prior to COVID 19 school closures, the school had attended several SPSSA competitions. The School has also partaken in several Portico competitions alongside.</p> <p>Participation to competitions in Spring/Summer term was halted due to school closures.</p> <p>Regular support and CPD has been available through memberships of the associations.</p> <p>During COVID 19 closures, SPSSA offered weekly activities for pupils to have access to PE activities at home allowing the school to be awarded the Virtual Games Award.</p>

<p>Whole school Gymnastics Teaching and on site CPD for staff.</p>	<p>£13,150</p>	<p>To give all pupils access to high quality gymnastics teaching (from ex international gymnast).</p> <p>To allow staff to have on site CPD during lessons to up skill subject knowledge.</p> <p>To allow gifted and talented pupils an opportunity for further, focussed gymnastics coaching provision.</p> <p>To improve pupils' fitness and understanding of gymnastics and muscle groups.</p> <p>To allow pupils access to equipment found only outside of school in specialist training centres. (Such as rings, parallel bars and high bar)</p>	<p>Pupils received expert peripatetic teaching in gymnastics, learning a wide range of skills.</p> <p>Pupils had a fantastic opportunity to use a wide range of specialist equipment and participate in activities that would not have been on offer within school. Pupils enjoyed activities ranging from –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pommel Horse • Jumping technique • Landing technique • Balance Beams • Floor activities such as correct rolling and backwards rolls • Trampoline • High bar • Rings • Trampoline runs aimed at improving cart wheels <p>Pupils who were often put off by engaging with gymnastics activity were all participating, with 100% of pupils from years 2-6 partaking in gymnastics lessons.</p> <p>Staff were able to observe high quality gymnastics teaching during on site CPD, boosting confidence in teaching the subject, improving their subject knowledge and ability to teach the subject within our own school.</p>
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Swimming Lessons	£1,988.17	To provide children increased swimming provision.	<p>Year 3 pupils and year 4 pupils were able to attend swimming lessons during Autumn terms.</p> <p>Due to Covid 19 – Spring and Summer term swimming interrupted.</p>
Transport to sporting opportunities – competitions and swimming	£2,015	<p>To provide all children with the opportunity to be able to participate in competitions outside of school.</p> <p>To enable children to access swimming lessons for a half term each year.</p>	<p>We participated in SPSSA and Portico sporting competitions across the year, providing pupils with the opportunity to compete against other schools.</p> <p>Every child in Years 3-4 received swimming lessons for a block of 6-7 weeks.</p> <p>Additional swimming for those assessed at being in danger of not achieving a suitable standard.</p>
Whole School PE Curriculum Day (Kidzfit)	£380	To promote health and fitness with the whole school population and to further engage children in regular activity.	<p>Another highly successful day of active learning twinned with healthy schools week.</p> <p>All pupils attended and were engaged to build a joy of sporting activity and keeping fit. Pupils developed a deeper understanding of the clear links between being active and a healthy lifestyle.</p> <p>Pupils delved deeper into the science behind keeping fit, the importance of cardio vascular exercise and how regular exercise can boost mental health and well-being.</p>
